

FingerFull Coffee Glove

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Materials

Needles: US Size 6 or 7 (4.0 or 4.5mm) you want the fabric to be thick enough that your skin doesn't touch the cup.

Gauge: 20 sts and 24 rows per 4x4 in square, not too important, see *Sizing*

Yarn: Brooklyn Tweed, Shelter, (150yds/50g) or comparable worsted weight yarn. 50 yds should be more than enough.

Notions: Tapestry Needle, your favorite coffeeshop to-go cup.

Sizing: This coffee sleeve is sized on a Grande Starbucks Cup, use your favorite coffeeshop's to-go cup as a size guide. To ensure a good fit, Knit fewer or more rows of the *Sleeve Body* in stockinette so the body is slightly smaller than the circumference of cup a finger-width or so from the top edge.

Sleeve Body

CO 20 sts, leaving 12 in. tail for seaming.

Row 1: Sl1 purl-wise, K remainder of row (RS)

Row 2: Sl1 purl-wise, P remainder of row (WS)

Rows 3-54: Repeat Rows 1 & 2, 26 times.

Connect to CO-edge

On RS row, insert needle knit-wise into first stitch, then through a st on the CO edge. K2tog to combine a live stitch and CO stitch, securing the two edges together. Continue in this manner across the row so that each live stitch is combined with a CO st into one working st. Purl one (1) row. (20 sts on needles)

Glove Pocket

Rows 1-20: Repeat rows 1 & 2 from *Sleeve Body* 10 times.

Row 21-24: Sl1 purl-wise, K remainder of row.

BO all stitches. I prefer using the Icelandic BO here to match the stitch texture of the last 2 garter ridges. You will also want to ensure that whichever end of the work you are ending on is the opposite side of your CO tail. This way you have thread already available to seam both sides of the glove pocket.

Icelandic Bind off: Insert right needle into first st and pull the second st knitwise through first stitch. K this (second) st, and pull both off the needle. To continue, ** insert left needle into the front loop of the first st on the right needle, without moving the st, sl the next st on the left needle through this st knit-wise as before, then K that st, and pull both sts off the left-hand needle.** Repeat from ** to ** until all sts have been BO.

Break yarn leaving a 12" tail for seaming and pull through last st.

Finishing

Starting with the CO tail, whip stitch the pocket edge and sleeve body edge together toward the BO edge. I always make a few whips together at the end to secure the stitch. Do the same with the BO tail, whip stitching toward the CO edge and fastening. Then weave in both ends on the inner cup-side of the sleeve.



Abbreviation	Meaning
K	Knit
P	Purl
CO	Cast On
BO	Bind Off
St(s)	Stitch(es)
K2tog	K two sts together
sl	slip
